

**Indian Meeting at Mattole—Saturday,  
Oct. 22d.**

At a meeting of the citizens of Mattole, to take into consideration the policy which is being pursued in regard to Indian matters in this district. Stephen Goff was called to the chair, and Francis Stansberry was chosen Secretary.

The meeting was briefly addressed by several citizens, after which a committee, consisting of F. Stansberry, James Jeffrey and C. W. Gillett, was appointed to draft resolutions expressive of the sense of the people.

The committee reported the following, which were unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS, We, the loyal citizens of Mattole, supporting the Government, and claiming a right to its protection, have learned with great regret and indignation, that it is the intention of the Superintendent of Indian affairs, to locate a Reservation at Hoopa Valley, from where the Indians can easily return to their former haunts.

RESOLVED, That no security to the persons or property of our citizens can be obtained without the removal of the hostile Indians which infest our county, to a point south of San Francisco, or to some other place so remote, that there will be no possibility of their return.

RESOLVED, That a copy of the above resolutions be forwarded to Senator Conness, and also to the Humboldt Times, with a request that the same be published.
