

~~More Indians Captured.~~ Lieutenant
Middleton of company C, 1st Batt. Mjs.
has just returned from another scout af-
ter Indians. The following particulars
will show with what energy and success
it has been prosecuted. He left camp at
Burnt Ranch in the early part of Octo-
ber, and after traveling several days and
many miles, came upon a band of Indians
on the 14th, in the vicinity of Brown's
creek, out of which he captured twenty
one. On the 15th he captured three on
Redding's creek; on the 17th one, on Salt
creek; on the 19th one, between Brown's
and Rush creeks; on the 20th two, on the
divide between Trinity river and French
Gulch; on the 21st two near Eastman's
diggings and six on Papoose creek, and
on the 23d at Ferry Bar, three, making
the total number captured thirty-nine.
