

NOME LACKEE RESERVATION.—Col. Henley, Indian Agent for California, who left the Reservation in Colusa county, on Sunday morning, furnishes us with the subjoined items:

There are now fifteen hundred Indians on the Reservation which is superintended over by Mr. Lovell, the Deputy Agent, Mr. Ford having gone over to the Coast. Everything denotes business, activity and industry about the grounds, the Indians being assiduously engaged in hauling hay, sowing wheat, building houses, and preparing for the rainy season. The health of the Indians is good, and they appear contented and happy in their civilized home.—*Sacramento Union.*
