

FIGHT WITH THE INDIANS IN SHASTA VALLEY.—On Thursday last, a party of sixteen men under Mr. Tupper, of Shasta Valley, fell in with a large body of Indians in the mountains dividing the waters of Klamath and Shasta Rivers. After a brief engagement, and losing one man, the whites were compelled to retreat.

It is rumored that two men, Mr. Snow of the Klamath River Ferry, opposite Beaver Creek, and a man by the name of Scott, have been killed on the trail leading from the Mountain House of Doty & Doyle to the Klamath River. A party of 25 or 30 started from Deadwood yesterday, to look into the matter. These two men left the mountain House on Tuesday evening last for the Ferry.
