Indian Movements.—The Shasta Courier learns from Yreka, that Major Fitzgerald accompanied by a portion of Capt. Wright's small independent company, has returned from his trip of reconnoisance into the Indian country. Major Fitzgerald intends returning to his winter quarters in boott Valley. Capt. Wright's men will return to their old station where the winter will be spent in hunting Indians. When Capt. Wright was left it was expected that he would have a brush with the Indians. About four hundred had been observed on the hills in the vicinity of his camp, where they had kindled fires, and were shouting and making other warlike demonstrations. Several squaws have been taken recently, who report that two white women were in possession of the Indians and that one had been killed by them. The story was afterwards confirmed by finding the body of a murdered woman in the place indicated by the squaws. Female clothing was also found in deserted Indian camps.
