

INDIAN MASSACRE.—La-Lakes, the Chief of the Klamaths, says the *Yreka Union* has received intelligence by an Indian of his tribe named Charley, of the massacre of three white men, on the head waters of Pitt river, on Sunday, the 31st of October. Charley says that the Indians have in possession the stock and property of the murdered men, consisting of one wagon, six head of cattle, six horses, two mules, several riding saddles, \$52 25 in silver, and between \$1,000 and \$2,000 in gold coin, besides a lot of clothing and camp equipage. La-Lakes is willing to furnish a party of Indians to join the whites in a foray against the Pitt river Indians, and says he can conduct a company to the Indians and property in three days.
