

WHITES MASSACRED BY INDIANS.—The Yreka *Union* of the 18th inst., says: La-Lake, the chief of the Klamath Lake Indians, has received intelligence by an Indian of his tribe, named Charley, of the massacre of three white men, on the head waters of Pitt river, on Sunday the 31st of October. Charley says that the Indians have in possession the stock and property of the murdered men, consisting of one wagon, six head of cattle, six horses, two mules, several riding saddles, fifty-two dollars and a quarter in silver, and between one and two thousand dollars in gold coin, besides a lot of clothing and camp equipage.
