**INDIAN DIFFICULTIES.**—The Yreka correspondent of the *Shasta Courier* states that a fight took place a short time since at Wright's Camp with 21 Indians. Two citizens were severely wounded. On the arrival of the party at Yreka, they paraded through the streets—the wounded being borne in litters—each of the party, consisting of 16 whites, 2 Indians, and a negro, having a bow and arrows, and the muzzle of his gun decorated with a scalp taken from the enemy.
