Edward McGarry has the Command of the regimental division stationed at Forts Seward, Humboldt and Gaston. This gentleman, an old resident of Napa county, fully understands the difficulties we labor under in regard to hostile Indians, and we feel assured that so far as it lays in his power the citizens of Humboldt county will be delivered from the terrible scourge which has weighed them down for so long a time.
