

"The Standard says the last of the Pitt river tribe..." The Placer Herald, December 17, 1859: p. 2, col. 4.

The *Standard* says the last of the Pitt river tribe of Indians arrived at Sacramento on Tuesday; among these braves were "Wild Cat," and the celebrated Indian chief "Chinquo-pin," who had an interview with Gen. Kibbe, and wore around his neck on that interesting occasion a pigtail twist of tobacco and a pair of slippers. The latter were given to him by a pious miner, in consideration of his learning the Lord's prayer. The chief we regret to say, has long since forgotten the prayer; but repeats Yankee Doodle, which seems to answer the same purpose.
