

TROOPS FOR EEL RIVER.—We noticed last week that Capt. Lovell had ordered Lieut. Lynn with a detachment of thirty men to proceed to South Fork of Eel river. Lieut. Lynn left Fort Humboldt yesterday with orders to the following effect, viz: To proceed via Lager Creek settlement to South Fork of Eel river, and give such protection to the settlers and their stock, against depredations of Indians, as circumstances may require; also to ascertain if any danger is apprehended at the stations on the mail route between Healdsburg and Eureka, and what protection may be necessary to render the route safe from Indian depredations. The Command is furnished with thirty days' rations and forty rounds of ammunition per man. Capt. Lovell has not hampered the officer with orders, but wisely left him at liberty to use his discretion.
