

MORE INDIAN DEPRIDATIONS.—Mr. McNamara informs us that the Indians in the vicinity of Neal's ranch, are daily depredating upon the property of the whites. One day last week they slaughtered thirty head of cattle, the property of Mr. E. L. Davis. A large proportion of these must have been killed from a spirit of wantonness, as no such number could be made available for food. Our informant states—and he is reliable—that more or less cattle are killed every day by the diggers in that portion of the county. ~~Beside the cattle immediately killed,~~ many are maimed and thereby depreciated in value. But a few days since six of Mr. Davis' cows were chased nearly to the ranch, with arrows sticking in them.
