

#### Hoopa Reservation.

We have received a letter from the office of the Superintendent of Indian Affairs, from which we learn that the Department of the Interior approves the location of the Reservation at Hoopa, and directs the Superintendent to proceed in the appraisal of the improvements as follows: "In consequence of the great distance of your field of labor, and the length of time occupied in communicating by letter, and in order that the arrangement with the Indians may as soon as possible be consummated to all parties, upon consultation with the Secretary of the Interior I am directed to authorize you to appoint not exceeding three discreet persons, who are to proceed without delay to make a just and fair valuation of the improvements referred to, and to forward their report through you at the earliest day practicable."

We are informed that it is the intention of the Superintendent to proceed with the business as soon as possible, in order, if it can be done, to lay the matter before Congress the present session, as that body has to confirm the action of the appraisers and set aside the land before payment can be made for improvements.
