30 men wanted to serve in the 1st Battalion, Mountaineers, Cal. Volunteers, until discharged. The service is special, and against the Indians in the Humboldt Military District.

Transportation, subsistence, clothing, blankets, etc. will be furnished the men as they are enrolled.

Volunteers will be entitled to \$100 Bounty from the U. S. Government, \$25 from Humboldt County. Monthly pay as allowed by army regulations, and five dollars per month additional pay by the State.
