1 brass field pieces

Six beautiful brass field pieces have been landed from the two transport ships now laying in the harbor, within the last few days. They compose the field battery of Col. Stevenson's regiment. The carriage upon which they are mounted, and the entire equipage are of the most substantial and durable construction.

Several thirty-two pounders have also been landed, which we understand, are to be mounted for the defence of the harbor.

Lieut. Warner, of the corps of engineers, left here by Gen. Kearny for this purpose, is actively engaged in making surveys for the fortifications to be constructed for the defence of the town and harbor.

The volunteer troops stationed at the Presidio we understand are busily employed in making preparatory arrangements for the commencement of these works.

A portion of the troops which left here a few days since, for Monterey, are destined for service against the Indians in the Tuleres, who have recently been very troublesome in their thefts and depredations. Nothing could be more delightful than an excursion through the valley of the San Joaquin, at this season of the year.
