Indian War in El Dorado County ! sonden and

We make room for the following account, condensed from he Transcript of yesterday, of a threatened Indian War. It seems that the Indians have asserted their claim to all the country round to within three leagues of Sutter's Fort, and nave said that they intended to sack and burn all the towns .-Many parties and individuals have been attacked and killed. and in some instances several hundred Indians in a body have suddenly attacked the whites. They have seut their wives and children into the mountains, which is a sign that they are bent on hostilities. The emigrants have been robbed and murdered.

Public meetings had been held in consequence in Coloma, Weberville, Placerville, Ringgold and Diamond Springs, and companies of fifty men raised for immediate service. Expresses were to be sent to the Governor for assistance. There is a very great excitement all through that section, a fierce Indian war being considered almost certain.
