### Miners' Meeting at Grass Valley.

In pursuance of a call made by the Miners of Grass Valley a meeting was held Nov. 22d, 1850, to take into consideration the necessity of having an armed force stationed at that place. At 10 o'clock A. M., the meeting was called to order by Mr. J. J. Adams, and John Nutter selected as Chairman, and James C. Taylor and John J. Adams were elected Secretaries.

The meeting was then addressed by the chairman in a few appropriate remarks, explaining the object of the meeting. He was followed by Mr. J. Blair of Ohio, who gave an animated address. The meeting was next addressed at length by Mr. E. Gart, in an eloquent and impressive manner, setting forth in glowing terms the necessity of sustaining the object of the meeting.

It was then resolved that Col. Rodgers be requested to have a military force stationed at Grass Valley, which resolution was carried unanimously.

It was then resolved that the proceedings of the meeting be accompanied by the names of all present, whereupon the following names were registered.

Mr. Blair again addressed the meeting,

Mr. Dean again addressed the meeting, stating the necessity of not selling to the Indians arms, ammunition, or spirituous liquors, and moved in the absence of any law against such transactions, that any such offence be visited or punished upon him committing it with the destruction of his house, cabin or tent, and that he be not considered as an American citizen; which resolution was unanimously adopted.

A motion was then made for a vote of thanks to the commanding officer (Col. Rodgers) for his gentlemanly and soldier-like conduct, which motion was carried unanimously.

Three cheers were then given for the Colonel, three for his officers and three also for the soldiers under their command. The meeting was then adjourned.
