From our knowledge of the first named gentleman, we feel certain that while the dignity and justice and protective policy of the Government will be fully maintained by them in their treaties and engagements with the Indians, those poor creatures will be protected against the unlawful acts of unprincipled white men, who are too ready to heap all manner of injuries upon them.
