crepancies, if any there were, in the volumes printed by Mr. Fitch.

Mr. Fry gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill to provide for the construction of a

railroad from Sacramento to Auburn.

Mr. Lott gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill to seperate the offices of County Recorder and County Auditor; also a bill to amend "an act concerning County Recorder."

A message was received from the Assembly, informing the Senate that the Governor had signed the joint resolution, directing the State Treasurer to suspend any further payment from the general fund, until the archives are removed to the place where the Legislature is now in session; also that he had signed the joint resolution authorizing the Supreme Court to hold its present term at San Francisco.

Mr. Warner gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill to provide for the government

and protection of the Indians.

Mr Soule called up the resolution of inquiry introduced by him yesterday, as to whether the State officers had been supplied with suitable offices. After some conversation the resolu-

tion was again tabled.

A communication was received from the Secretary of State, transmitting to the Senate correct copies of the 14th and 15th sections of the act passed last session, re-apportioning the representation of the several counties in the Legislature; and also informing the Senate, substantially, that the manuscript copy of the act passed last session, reducing the salaries of members and officers, purported on its face to have been signed by the Governor the same day it was passed, viz.: May 1, 1851. The communication was referred to the Judiciary committee.

Mr. Broderick, from the select committee on Finance, to which was referred the resolution directing the Attorney General to prosecute defaulting County Treasurers, reported the same back; recommended that no action be taken upon it, because the duty of prosecuting those officers is devolved, by the Statutes, upon the Comptroller.

Mr. Robinson gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill to provide for the re-organization and the nay of the militia of this State
