

SENATE.—After the minutes were read, Hon. Mr. Fry, Senator from Placer, offered a bill authorizing the construction of a Rail Road from Sacramento to Auburn.

Hon. Mr. Lott gave notice that he would introduce a bill separating the offices of County Recorder and Auditor and a bill to amend an act concerning County Recorders.

A message from the Governor, stating that he had signed the Joint Resolution authorizing the Supreme Court to hold their sittings in San Francisco. Also, the Joint Resolution directing the State Treasurer to make no further payments until the archives shall be removed to the place where the Legislature may be in session.

Hon. Mr. Van Buren gave notice that he would introduce a bill to establish Boards of Supervisors. Also, a bill to amend an act concerning courts of justice in this State and judicial officers.

Hon. Mr. Keyser introduced a resolution, which passed, requesting the Secretary of State to furnish accurate information from the certified copies of the laws to the Senate, respecting the apportionment of Senators and Representatives.

It was stated that there were many mistakes in the copy of the laws as it is published by Mr. Fitch, and a resolution was adopted requesting the Secretary of State to report a list of the errors contained in the printed copy.

Hon. Mr. Warner gave notice that he would introduce a bill providing for the government and protection of Indians and repeal the act of 1850.

In answer to a request from the Senate, the Secretary of State informed the Senate that to all appearances the salary act had been signed on the 1st of May last.

The Finance Committee reported against the passage of the resolution concerning county treasurers: adopted.

Hon. Mr. Robinson gave notice that he would introduce a bill organizing the militia of the State, and to repeal the present military law.

Hon. Mr. Snyder offered a joint resolution authorizing the Governor to request the Secretary of the Interior to grant permission to the surveyor-general of this State to survey the swamp lands: read twice, and referred to the Committee on Public Lands.

Hon. Mr. Keyser gave notice that he would introduce a bill to amend an Act regulating proceedings in civil cases: read twice and referred to Judiciary Committee.

The Assembly concurrent resolution respecting the appointment of a committee of three from each house to consult with Gen. Vallejo respecting the removal of the seat of government, was taken up and passed. Messrs. De la Guerra, Cooke and Soule were named on the part of the Senate.

ASSEMBLY.—In the House a memorial was read from citizens of Vallejo, praying for relief, which was referred to the Com. on Claims.
