California on Hon Alex. N. N. Stuart
Secretary of Interior, made payable
to and endorsed by Mr. Charles Fremont.

Dated San Francisco August 11th 1851
Three days after sight, for Five
Thousand Dollars, drawn by G. H.
Barbour, Indian agent, on Hon A.
N. N. Stuart, made payable to and en-
dorsed by John Charles Fremont.

The
Three Drafts dated San Francisco
were protested for non acceptance
on the 29th September 1851. The one

Dated Fort Miller was protested for
non acceptance on the 9th October 1851.

The money for these drafts was ad-
vanced by our house in San Francisco.
We having purchased them at the regular
rate of Exchange, ruling on the day of
purchase.

The funds raised on them
were applied to the purchase of Cattle
to be delivered by the United States.

Agent to the Indians. and as we have
Every reason to believe that the United
States obtained a valuable Consideration
for the money they received of us. We
have to request that You will at Your
earliest convenience bring the matter before
Congress. to the end that our just
Claim may be paid.
