**From Humboldt--Arrival of the Goliah.**  
The Steamer Goliah, Capt. J. T. Wright, arrived yesterday from Humboldt Bay in a passage of thirty hours. She left on the 3d inst. From Wm. Wright, Purser, we learn that four trains had arrived at Union and report the roads to the Klamath and Trinity mines in good traveling condition—with some snow on the highest peaks. A rumor prevailed in Bucksport, brought in by an Indian, that two white men had been murdered on the Eel river trail leading to the Trinity river. Mules were very scarce, many having perished in the mountains during the winter.

The Steamer *Goliah*, Capt. J. T. Wright, arrived yesterday from Humboldt Bay in a passage of thirty hours. She left on the 3d inst. From Wm. The *Goliah* left this port on the 28th ult. having on board one hundred and twenty tons of government stores and two companies of U. S. troops under command of Lt. Col. Buchanan, who were left encamped, with Dr. Drydale, Lts. Bonycastle, Underwood, Scott and Crooks, at Bucksport.
