100 Indians from San L.

About 100 Indians from San Luis Rey honored our city with a visit yesterday. They came for the purpose of paying their respects to the Indian Agent, (Indians always have an eye to business) and to collect some presents. In accordance with the authority vested in him, Mr Wilson distributed some agricultural implements among them, the receipt of which seemed to give them infinite satisfaction.

FROM THE GILA. Col. Hooper, who has just arrived from the Gila, reports that a large number of Sonorians are coming to this state. The Indians are quiet.

Major Hintzelman will start about the 1st of April on an exploring expedition up the Colorado. The barracks at Fort Yuma are commenced.
