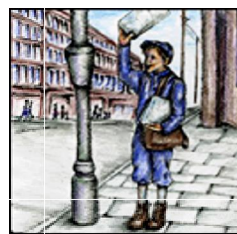

Severe rains prevailed among the mountains during the fore part of the past week.

Mining news from French Gulch, from the Washington Quartz Company, from Pitt River, &c., continues favorable.

A company was fitted out at Cottonwood, where the Indians are very troublesome, and going out, killed some ten or fifteen of them.
