VENGEANCE ON THE INDIANS.—Mr. G. C. Lusk, of Adams & Co.'s Express, informed us a few days ago of the theft of twenty-four head of work oxen, near Red Bluffs, from Mr. Tomlinson. The same gentleman leaves with us the following description of the pursuit that ensued: Accompanied by twelve men, Mr. Tomlinson followed the Indians to the head of Clay Bank Creek, seventy-five miles in the mountains. A rancheria was discovered, containing a population of some three or four hundred Indians, three of whom they succeeded in killing. The others having been warned of the approach of Mr. Tomlinson and party, saved themselves by flight. The cattle had all been slaughtered and hung up to dry, excepting one, which was found only half skinned. This, with the balance of the meat, was cast into the Indian wigwams, and the whole consumed by fire.—*Sac. Union*

PACK TRAIN.—A train of sixteen pack mules, belonging to Mr. Hall, passed through this place on Wednesday destined for Gold Canon, Carson Valley. They were loaded with dry goods, groceries, boots, shoes, &c., for the miners in that region. The train goes by the way of Johnson's Cut-Off—*El Dorado (Placerville) News*
