Sir

Yours of
28th July last came to hand by the mail of
last night pr St. Sonora. The instructions
therein contained will be strictly complied
with, except that the obligation I am under,
and of which I have informed you in my
communication of a recent date, to supply the
Military Post at Tejon may compel me for a
time at least to depart from the strict letter
of your direction. My arrangement shall be
concluded as soon as ^{Maj Donalson, the Sr. Master,} we can procure supplies
from Los Angeles. So soon as that can be
done, no further sales of any article on the
reserve shall be made, unless advised by
you.
I am of opinion that of flour and

barly there will be every year a surplus,
which could be sold to advantage; and from
which source it is very important that the
Post should receive its supply, in order to
save the Government the cost of transporting
those heavy articles a distance of one hundred
and fifty miles.

In this climate it is scarcely
possible to save and preserve wheat for a
longer period than one year.

Enclosed I send
you Invoices of the estimated amount of the
produce of the Reservation this year. I
have taken means to ascertain as near as
possible the precise amounts, which will be
reported in due time.
