**Yuba.**

The Marysville papers of Thursday were handed us yesterday by Adams & Co.'s messenger.

John T. McCarty, Esq. is to address the citizens of Marysville this evening, and will reply to Mr. John Bigler's speech of Monday.

A call has been made by Mr. McMeans, late a member of the Legislature from Klamath county, to raise a company of sixty volunteers in San Francisco to aid in quelling the Indian disturbances in the northern portion of the State. The San Francisco *Sun* characterizes it as a call made for buncomb, and expresses strong disapprobation of the course pursued towards the Indians heretofore in the State.

**San Joaquin.**

Wells, Fargo & Co. were first in the delivery of the San Joaquin *Republican* of Thursday.

The new steamer intended for the Stockton trade, the property of Capt. Whitney will be ready in a few days. She is 175 feet long, 35 feet beam, and will probably make the trip to Stockton in seven hours.
