We find in the Marysville Herald the following additional news relative to the Indian hostilities in Rogue river Valley:

Gen. Lane, with a party of eight or ten men, visited the Indian encampment on last Sunday They found 250 able bodied warriors; 150 sick and disabled, 111 iffee and 86 pistols, Coli's, Allen's, and single barrel. The Indians say, that some time since the whites see'ed to them one half of the valley, on conditions of their releasing all claims to the see and the see tion of their relessing all claim to the remaining half; that the whites are now settling the whole valley without remutereting them; that if the Americans will p y them for their lands, they will surrender their arms, and allow to be retained out of the money a sufficient amount to pay a'l damages they have done to private property. A final waws fixed for Wedneeday, the 31st.

The Herald very properly reproves the doctrine of extermination, as inducing us into a protracted and bloody warfare. And the proposed treaty is in such terms, that its rejection must raise doubts of the sincerity and pro priety of the purpose of the whites in this war.
