

Sacramento City Sept. 29' 1854
To the Secretary of the Interior

The undersigned
impressed with the necessity of immediate
action in regard to the removal of the
Indians to the reservation recently selected
by the Superintendent have advised him
to raise money to accomplish that object by
a draft upon you for a portion of the
appropriation for the removal and sub-
sistence of Indians on this Coast.

These Indians have been disappointed
so often by Government Agents making
treaties with them and promises of subsistence
that were never performed that if their wants
are not now supplied they never will again
have anything to do with these agents and
they will have to be removed from the
white settlements by force. The citizens of
the State where these Indians reside have
also lost all faith in efforts of the Gov-
ernment to rid them of these Indians. and
there is an important necessity of showing
both that the money appropriated, will
be at once used for the purposes indi-
cated by Congress
