Sir,

I wrote you last fr^y to Whaling in the 30th ult^o, requesting an order for personal Arms for the party, to be sent to me at N York. On the 31st - the day I left Whaling, Mr. Barber arrived from Kentucky, and after a short interview, (in which I advanced him my acct. of his salary, & mileage, the sum of \$2000,) he set out on his return to his family, with the understanding, that with Dr. Mendenhall, he would meet me either at Savannah or Chazco, via New Orleans. At his suggestion, I write now to request the favor of your procuring for the party, from the State Department, a full copy of the Rights of the Laws of the U. S.: a copy of the Volume of Indian Treaties, and any other Books you may find there, calculated to throw light upon the Antiquated doubts in California. The above, we think it important to have with us. And I hope you may be able to send them by Express, to Gen. Wiley Wilbur of Scott at York prior to the 11th inst.
