Sir,

I have the honor to enclose a receipt for the Indian goods, purchased by me, in California, in August last, by which it will be seen that the goods were delivered to Agent Heintzelman. As Col. Nauman appears to be uneasy lest he should be held responsible for these goods, and as it is shown by the certificate of Agent Heintzelman, appended to the receipt, that they never were in his (Col. N's) possession, I would respectfully suggest that steps be taken to have the goods charged to Agent Heintzelman on the books of the Treasury.

I also enclose duplicates of the bills. All of the articles therein specified were shipped to Fort Sumner, except the first two items, in the bill of Eugene Kelly and Co. viz 1 pr scarlet blankets a \$6⁵⁰/₁₀₀, and 5 shirts a \$1⁵⁰ - \$7.50 which should be charged to the use of property consumed.
