Report of labor performed during the week
commencing Apr 3rd and ending Apr 9th
of A. D. 1869

Monday 3rd No frost weather fair, with cool
winds and frosty night.

Tuesday 4th Driscoll harrowing, Tucker and 3 Indians ploughing
— 2 teams — McClanahan 20 squaws and 10
Indians raking ground and sowing carrots.
Davidson & 14 Indians planting potatoes.
Shirwood at Capell. 5 squaws sowing, weather
clear, cool winds and frost.

Wednesday 5th
All hands same as yesterday
4 squaws sowing — fair and warm.

Thursday 6th All hands same as yesterday except
McClanahan and 20 squaws sowing Beets,
3 Indians cutting wood for coal pit. 5
squaws sowing. Shirwood at Capell putting
in crops. Fair & warm.

Friday 7th All hands same as yesterday —
cloudy & warm.

Saturday 8th Raining all day.

Sunday 9th Continued rain. All hands getting.

Sunday 10th Heavy rain all day. Ind. Ayt. D. C. Baul
left for Crescent City

Monday 11th Continued rain. All hands mending
brush fence, except Ferrill, hauling wood
for coal pit. Chirwood down from Cap Mt.

Tuesday 12th

Trailer Chirwood and 12 Indians
carrying rails for fence. M. Clamahan &
15 Squaws clearing ground for Pumpkins,
Ferrill hauling wood for coal, set 4 rails,
Davidson and 3 Indians ploughing. D. C. Baul
Ind. Ayt. came down from Crescent City in
the dug boat, with goods for Reservation,
for Squaws sewing. Master Allen, old man

Wednesday 13th

Davidson Ferrill and 5 ploughing 2 times -
M. Clamahan and 6 Squaws sewing. Axtell
Chirwood returned to Cap Mt. Chirwood mending
Plough in forenoon, afternoon working with
4 Indians & 12 Squaws, clearing land and ploughing
up manure, 4 Squaws sewing. D. C. Baul

returned to Crescent-City. Weather clear & warm

Thursday 14th - Smith, Davidson and 4 Indians
ploughing, 2 teams - Tucker & Indians 2
yokes spading up land for Pumpkins,
M^r Clanchan and 15 yokes preparing
ground and sowing Corn, Thinned at
Capell, clearing land for beans & yokes
sowing, D. E. Buel Ind left returned from
Crescent-City clear and warm.

Friday 15th All hands same as yesterday
Clear and warm.

Saturday 16th Smith harrowing, Davidson and 2
Indians ploughing, M^r Clanchan and 10
yokes planting Corn, Tucker and 3
Indians gone to Mountain Creek for Corn
Thinned at Capell - 6 yokes sowing
Clear with cold wind,

hoing garden, Thurmond at Capell
5 Squaws sewing, weather clear and warm,

Tuesday 19th All hands same as yesterday
except M^r Clamason and 20 Squaws &
Indians planting potatoes, 3 Squaws sewing,
Clear & warm.

Wednesday 20th All hands same as yesterday,
Thurmond at Capell, 3 Squaws sewing,
Clear, with cold wind.

Thursday 21st All hands same as yesterday
Clear and warm

Friday 22^d Tucker, Sanderson, and 8 Indians
ploughing and making fence, at Hoppe
Merrill hating and making fence for to Hoppe

Mr. Clanchan & D. C. Buel went up the
river for Indians that had been stealing
potatoes, Shirwood at Copell, & Squaw's
sowing, Cloudy.

Saturday 23

Outlet, Davidson same as yesterday
in forenoon, Prill, Mr. Clanchan and
12 Squaw's planting Potatoes, Shirwood at
Copell, & Squaw's sowing, Rain in the afternoon.

and 4 Indians making brush fence
Tucker at Crescent City. Thurwood at
Cap. Ill. Cloudy.

Wednesday 26th all hands employed same as
yesterday. Clear and warm.

Thursday 27th Mr. Clancher, Davidson and 4
Indians ploughing at Hoppen & 2 teams -
Ferrill harrowing, 6 Indians making brush
fence. Ind Sgt D. E. Buel and Tucker
returned from Crescent City. Light rain.

Friday 28th Mr. Clancher sowing peas. Tucker
Davidson & 4 Indians ploughing. Ferrill
harrowing & 6 Indians making fence.
Thurwood at Cap. Ill. Cloudy.

Friday 29th All hands employed same as
yesterday. Clear and warm. 5 squads sewing.

Saturday 30th

Will be sewing at Hoppe, McClanahan
Wether & 4 Indians ploughing & team
Davidson & 6 Indians making pole &
brush fence. Sherman came down
from Capell. 5 squads sewing.
Clear and high winds.

Sunday 1st No work. Rainy

Monday 2^d Mr. Clamahan, Tucker & 4 Indians ploughing, Smith harrowing, Davidson & 6 Indians making fence, Sherwood went to Gab. test 5 squaws sewing, Cloudy & rainy.

Tuesday 3^d Mr. Clamahan & 2 Indians sawing timber and making rails, Tucker and 2 Indians went to Hunters Creek after cattle, Smith harrowing, Davidson & 10 squaws clearing land, Sherwood at Gab. test, 5 squaws sewing. Cloudy & cool.

Wednesday 4th Mr. Clamahan sewing feet, Smith and 2 Indians sawing rails, Tucker harrowing, Davidson & 5 squaws spading up land and planting seed, Sherwood at Gab. test, 5 squaws sewing.

Thursday 5th Mr. Clamahan and 4 Indians making rails, Tucker and 3 Indians sawing rails, and laying up fence, Smith harrowing, Davidson and Sherwood same as yesterday.

Monday 6th All hands employed same as yesterday,
Raining in afternoon, 5 squares sewing,

Tuesday 7th Mr. Clancham, Tucker, & 18 squares
planting potatoes, Ferrill harrowing, Fairclough
and 5 squares to assist in garden.

Showered at night. Most of the Indians
are now engaged in fishing, 5 squares sewing
Meastin fair. Snd. Capt. D. E. Bond - went to C. City

from C. City - High wind,

& 15 Squaws, weeding Carrots & Turnips,
Sanderson repairing mill house, Sherwood
at mill house, noon

7 Squaws sewing, Ind Agt - G. E. Bent gone
to Happy Camp.

Tuesday 18th M^r Clanchan and 18 Squaws hewing potatoes
Sutler burning coal pit, Smith sick,
Davidson chopping wood Shunned at Mah-tuk,
8 Squaws sewing, Windy

Wednesday 19th M^r Clanchan and 18 Squaws hewing
potatoes, Sutler burning coal pit, Davidson
tending mill, Smith sick, Shunned at
