**MURDERED**—We are informed that the body of a well dressed man was found on Sunday last, about a mile from the Cosumnes river, near Sears & Baldwin's ranch, under circumstances clearly indicating that he had been murdered and probably robbed. A gun-shot wound was found in the right leg, a stab in the breast, the skull mashed in, and a bloody club near the body. The left hand pocket had been turned out and nothing was discovered in the others except a pen knife and a comb. An envelope picked up near by bore the inscription of "Gilman S. Sanburn, Marysville."
