INDIAN DIFFICULTIES.—The Mariposa Chronicle says that “Scipiano, with about two hundred Indians, is mining near the junction of the North and South Forks of the Merced river. A few days since, one of Scipiano’s Indians was robbed and severely beaten by a party of Indians from the Yo Semity Valley. As soon as it was made known to Scipiano, he started with a large party of his tribe in pursuit of the fugitives, but was unable to overtake them, they evidently having placed a spy to watch his movements. He, however, followed them as far as the Yo Semity valley, where he found the rancheria deserted, the Indians having fled to the mountains. He destroyed their village, and returned with the plunder left by the Indians in their flight.”
