I received your letter on the 14th Inst
instructing me to take Charge of the
Mendocino Reservation, which order I antici-
pated as I was informed that the Reservation
Property was much scattered and no care
taken to preserve it, I therefore appointed
Mr A Smith Jr. as Supervisor to take Charge
of and safely keep until I will be able to
attend to it myself, which will be very soon
I have visited some Sucker and Trout
Cult the Service of property is made but
the valuation thereof is not yet agreed to
Things seem indeed in a bad Condition so
far as I have seen, I will report all
as soon as I have examined sufficiently and

ascertained the true condition of things
All communication from the Department
to me had better be addressed to Ikhama Cal
The Law makes no provision for a Clerk
it is therefore useless to have my office
in Shasta with no one in it, There is
great dissatisfaction among the former employ-
ees They all claim back pay and no
money to pay them, I hope you will send
me further instructions, The Indians at
Some Cult are without clothing They have
fine crops of Indian Corn Potatoes &c. Some
Cult is in an elevated region the nights already
cold and frosty, that without clothing they
cannot gather the crops Respectfully Sir
