Dear Sir

I have been absent from the city for several months & but lately returned, I found a letter from you in which you state that certain parties prefer charges of gambling, drunkenness & lewdness against you, during your stay in California, all I can say, is that I was in your company for more than a month & neither saw or heard of anything of the kind & that during the time I had the pleasure of being associated with you, your conduct was that of a gentleman.

Mr Prof Browne read a portion of a letter from you, a day or two ago, in which you say, that I have a charge of \$75⁰⁰ for escorting the party of which you were a member, when here; with regard to that, I have to say, that all the money I spent for expenses from the day I met you at Romer Locke until I arrived at San Francisco, amounted to about \$68.⁰⁰, the receipts for which you will find filed with the papers in Washington. Mr Clement need \$100⁰⁰ for his months work with his own minerals & I had my regular salary of \$125⁰⁰ which would have been paid, even if you had not been there,

as I should have had to come back to San Fran...
after having debinned the cattle I then had in charge,
so you see that there is some mistake.

A large party of us had a fine hunt this
summer, our regular yearly hunt, & intend to
have another next June, if we live & all is right,
& if you can come will be glad to have you.
