INDIAN DIFFICULTIES.—From the Shasta Courier, we learn that the Indians in the Cow Creek country, have again assumed a hostile attitude towards the whites. Within the past four or five days, they have stolen from the ranches about one hundred head of stock, among them some very fine horses and mules. Mr. Long, of Shasta, is a loser to the amount of some ten or fifteen of his most valuable mules.

On Thursday last, the Indians in large numbers visited Churn Town, on the east side of the Sacramento river, and run the whites away from the place. The people of Churn Town had, on the day previous, pursued and killed several of the savages while making their way to the mountains with a lot of stolen property.

ROBBERY IN TRINITY COUNTY.—A correspondent of the Shasta Courier writing from Oregon Gulch, says that the cabin of Riley and Fagan, about ten miles from that place, was robbed on the 17th, of notes and gold dust to the amount of \$3600, besides a large quantity of clothing and provisions. The Digger Indians are suspected of being the guilty parties.

STOLEN STOCK.—There were forty head of fine horses discovered near Dry Camp a few days ago. They had been concealed in the neighboring chaparral. Mexican thieves in the vicinity have driven off great numbers of them towards Sonora. A large party had started in pursuit of the thieves.
