NEW CHURCH.—A plan has been proposed for an Episcopal church edifice in Marysville, the dimensions of which are given in the Express as follows: "It is proposed to build it of brick, 30 feet front by 70 in depth. The height from the base to the top of the steeple, is to be 75 feet; height of ceiling from the floor to the top of the arch, 35 feet. The design, both externally and internally, is purely Gothic." A church organization has also been effected.

RUMORED MURDER OF STORMS AND KING WEIMAR.—A. Delano, Esq., has favored us with the following intelligence. A report was current at Grass Valley yesterday, that S. P. Storms and King Weimar had been killed by the Shasta Indians. They left a few days since to visit the "Reservation." It is sincerely hoped that the report may prove unfounded.

CRESCENT CITY CHURCH.—The Presbyterian congregation of Crescent City, Klamath county, having nearly completed their church edifice, a board of trustees has been elected to take charge of the building and grounds. The church is under the pastoral charge of Rev. Mr. Lacy.

MILITARY ROAD.—An appropriation has been made of \$20,000 for the purpose of extending the military road from Myrtle Creek to Scottsburgh (O. T.,) but this sum, says the Gazette, will not be sufficient to complete the extension, and erect bridges over the Umpqua.
