Dear Sir

I am solicited by the citizens residing in this vicinity to represent to you the necessity of establishing an Indian agency at this place, we are at least one hundred miles distant from any other settlement and separated from them by the Sierra Nevada Mountain.

The "Mono" Indians who inhabit this section of country are very numerous and appear displeased at the appearance of the whites among them, slight misunderstandings already exist and as there are not exceeding Eighty whites in the settlement we would be wholly unable to defend ourselves in case of an outbreak, which is to be hoped will be avoided;

The early establishment of an agency here is much required for the better security of peace with the Indians of this portion of the state.
Hoping that the proposition may meet with your favorable consideration.

The undersigned Settlers and residents
in Walker River hereby petition your
Honr for the Establishment of a Reser-
vation or Agency for the Indians in the
above locality and its vicinity and for
cause represent as follows viz. —

That the Indians and at Mornah
or Mono Lake about twelve miles from
the settlement in the River number
several thousand who if hostile would
certainly endanger or perhaps utterly
destroy the lives and property of the
White residents in their neighborhood.
The population is rapidly increasing on
Walker River and the public's attention
now being given to its mines promises a
large accession next spring and summer.
The near neighborhood and daily contact
of the two races will inevitably breed
hostilities unless some such method as
as the one proposed be speedily adopted

and carried into effect.

Some few collisions

and differences have already occurred but happily by timely effort a good understanding now exists between the two races and the temper of the Indians at this time is such towards our own people that they could now be easily induced to submit to the desired changes which otherwise would be more difficult after hostilities had become serious.
