Sir.

I have the honor to acknowledge, through the Adj. Genl's Office, the receipt of copies of certain letters from the Dept. of the Interior in relation to the distribution of certain goods among the Pima and Maricopa Indians, and instructions in relation thereto from the Secy. of War.

In reply, I have to state, that on the arrival of Ft. P. Heintzleman, Esqr. Indian Agent, at this post, he assumed the charge of them, as will be seen by the paper I enclose herewith, and that when they reached this point, he took possession of them. The invoices, and the letter of Godard Baily, Esqr. to me of the 21<sup>st</sup> of Sept. last, were placed in his hands for his regulation.
