W. H. Moon, administrator, vs. P. H. Hood.

Suit to receive \$1338.22, retained by defendant, as fees of auctioneer, upon a sale of sheep belonging to the estate of Damas Lopez, deceased. The cause was decided on Saturday last, by a verdict allowing defendant \$1000, the balance to be paid by plaintiff; costs to be paid by plaintiff. The court decided, among other points, that an administrator is not bound to employ an auctioneer in sales of property of the estate, but if he employ an auctioneer in sales of property of the estate; but if he employ an auctioneer or other person, without an express contract for his compensation, the Probate Court may allow such compensation as the services are reasonably worth.

Motion for new trial. Judge J. W. Robinson, for plaintiff. Col. Wm. C. Ferrell and Judge Witherby, for defendant.

The parties finally compromised the cause.

The People vs. Pablo Narcis, an Indian.—Indictment for murder. The case occupied Monday, and depended on the testimony of five Indian witnesses. The jury were out fifteen minutes, and returned with a verdict of "not guilty." Judge Robinson and L. Granger, Esq., for the State; Col. Wm. C. Ferrell, and Joseph B. Wells, Esq., (of San Francisco,) for the defence.

Hugh Forster and Isaac A. Goldman, were admitted to be naturalized as citizens of the United States.
