TROOPS ON THE KLAMATH DISBANDED.—Lieut. Williams, of the Union Volunteers, with a portion of the men, arrived in town on Sunday from the Klamath. The three companies in service were dismissed by Capt. Judah, of the U. S. A. We learn that they intend to forward their muster rolls and other evidences of service to their representatives in the Legislature, at an early day of the present session. If any men ever deserved pay they do, and we hope they will have the aid and co-operation of all the delegation from this Senatorial District, in their endeavors to get it.— In connection with this subject, we should be pleased to know why it is that one Captain was singled out and commissioned while there were two others in the same camp and service at the same time, who were passed by. Capt. Young has received his commission from John Bigler while Capt. Chestey and Marion Woodward have not been mentioned.
