CROPS IN HOOPA.—The wheat crop of Hoopa is now harvested and will equal in yield that of any portion of the State or the world. The farmers in that valley have not been troubled with "smut or rust." Capt. Snyder's crop will exceed five thousand bushels, besides seed and a fair amount for home consumption. His proximity to the mines will give him the benefit of the price of packing from this place, which is three and a half cents in addition to its value here. The yield of the barley, oats and root crops are also very flattering to the beneficiaries.
