THE MURDERER OF MR. WIGMORE KILLED.—A friend writes us from Eel river, Sunday 24th.

"Capt. Pomeas, the chief, and his company have returned, from their search after the murderers of Wigmore. They brought the head of one of them that they killed last night. I readily recognized his countenance as one of the murderers named by the Indians. They also brought the revolver belonging to deceased and told where his gun was, or could be found, broken. We found the breach, but not the barrel. I have the pistol and head in my possession. They are going out again to night in search of two others they have heard from.— We have told them to bring them alive if possible."
