

Two Frenchmen fought a duel near Oakland, on Friday, resulting in the death of one of them.

On Saturday morning, during a fire on First street, Thomas Murray, an energetic fireman, belonging to Engine Co. No. 11, lost his life by the falling of a chimney upon him.
