The proposition to fund \$1,500,000 of the city debt at 10 per cent. per annum for 20 years, meets with strong opposition from the tax payers. It has passed the Board of Assistants, but will undoubtedly be lost in the Board of Aldermen. It is thought that 8 per cent. is a sufficiently high rate of interest.

The Indian disturbances in the north still continue. In a recent fight with the Indians in Klamath county, the following named white men were killed :—

Charles K. Proctor, Proctorville, Vermont; Chandler H. Dunham, of Plymouth, Massachusetts; William Wheeler, Wadsworth county, Wisconsin; Tuos. O'Neill, of New Orleans; and John Smith, of St. Domingo; Wm. Lamb, of Oregon, and Mr. Johnson, of Mississippi, were mortally wounded.

The native Californians are contemplating removing, in a body, to Sonora. They allege as a reason for this step, that here they are oppressed by unjust laws, and that the burthens of taxation are more than they can bear.

The election in Tuolumne county, on the 8th inst., for a member of the Assembly, resulted in the election of McCurdy, (Whig,) by about two hundred majority.

The ship *John Land*, of Boston, heretofore reported missing, has been heard from at one of the Marquesas Islands, leaking badly.

The theatres of San Francisco are doing a miserable business generally speaking, although the San Francisco Hall is nightly filled, the negro minstrels forming the great attraction.

From Washington Territory we learn that Gov. Stevens has made several treaties with the Indians of that territory, and was proceeding towards Shoalwater Bay for a similar purpose.

The U. S. sloop-of-war *St. Marys* arrived at this port on the 10th inst., from Honolulu, bringing papers of the 27th ult. The Sandwich Islands news is not important. The King had appointed his Ministry, R. C. Wyllie being the most important personage therein.
