

**MARYSVILLE CHARTER NOMINATIONS.**—The Marysvillains have nominated a "union ticket," which is composed of the following candidates: For Mayor, Chandler B. Fowler. For Aldermen—First Ward—William Williams, J. W. Winters; Second Ward—M. Gray, Chas. H. Hedges; Third Ward—J. B. Leaman, John F. Snow; Fourth Ward—Henry Leland, Col. J. F. Halsey. For Marshal, J. P. Ripley. This is generally known as the "*Sabe Mucho*" ticket. Election on Monday next, March 5th.

**THE MOUSE INDIANS.**—The *Shasta Courier* says that several men and forty or fifty squaws, with their children, belonging to this tribe of Indians, are now on Dye's Ranch, and desirous of making a treaty with the whites, as they have recently been set upon by a party of the latter.

**BUTTE MINING.**—About thirty claims on the opposite side of the river from Bidwell are being worked. These are mostly supplied by the Express Water Company. A tunnel, running from the edge of the river, under the Bidwell Shade Hotel, to the Plaza claim, is nearly completed.
