

On the 9th, arrived the French frigate *La Forte*, Admiral Fournichon, from Callao, and the English frigate *Amphytrite*, Capt. Fredericks, both from Callao. Both vessels sailed again for the northward, the *Amphytrite* on the 12th, and the *Forte* on the 15th.

On the 11th, arrived the *Obligado* brig, and on the 19th, the *Eurydice*, frigate, both French, and after two or three days delay for fresh provisions, they also took their departure for the north, perchance to be food for Russian powder.

We have now in harbor only the U. S. sloop of war *Decatur*, Commander Stewart, and the British storeship *Rattlesnake*.

The British line of battle ship *Monarch*, is said to be looked for here shortly, also *en route* for the north, so there is likely to be some hard knocks given and taken at Petropaulowski this summer. The allies, very naturally, are anxious to retrieve the losses of last year.

MORE INDIAN DEPREDACTIONS.—The following, says the *Yreka Herald*, is reliable information from a friend of known veracity:

EDS. HERALD:—On Saturday last, (June 2d,) a small party of our citizens were waylaid in Deer Creek Valley, and a man by the name of Fillput killed, and another whose name I have not learned was wounded. The number of Indians engaged in this affair is not known. It is supposed, however, that some eighty or more are prowling about in that section of country and in all probability other depredations have been committed by them ere this. Our Indian relations in this section have again assumed a hostile appearance. A detachment of Dragoons are in the field, but whether they will effect anything more than they effected in the case of the murder of "Hill," some three weeks since, remains to be seen.
