MOVEMENT OF TROOPS.—The monotony of the past week has been agreeably broken by the arrival in our city of a detachment of fifty U. S. troops, I. W. T. Gardner, of the 1st Dragoons, *en route* for the Tejon, increasing the force at that point to nearly 100 strong, under the command of Lieut. Col. Beale. Asst. Q. M. Capt. Kirkham, from Jefferson Barracks, Mo., accompanies the detachment.

There is no point in the State where an effective force is needed, and where their presence can be rendered of greater service, than the Tejon, as it completely controls the great thoroughfares through which hostile Indians make their incursions into our valleys, for the purposes of robbery and spoils.—*Southern Californian*, 12th.
