COMMON COUNCIL.

Board of Aldermen-June 28.

Present, Aldermen Hyde, Gough, Van Bokkelen, Buckingham, Moore, Norton, Van Ness, and Atwill in the Chair.

Communication from the Mayor—Relative to the recording of city land titles at the U S. Land Office.

Received and placed on file.

Report of Auditing Committee—Mr. Van Bokke len, from the Auditing Committee, reported in favor of paying sundry bills, being all that are before the committee, and by which it now closes its labors. The bills were ordered paid. Mr. Van Bokkelen re marked that the policy of the committee had been to allow bills to go first into the Board of Assistants, and to concur or reject as they deemed proper. That there were now no bills before them and that henceforth if any one desired to know where the bills were to be found, they must look for them in the Comptroller's office.

Funding Judgments.—An ordinance from the other Board providing for the funding of all judgments founded on existing indebtedness hereafter obtained in accordance with the act recently passed by the

Legislature, was laid on the table.

Powder Limits.—An ordinance prohibiting the storing or keeping of powder within the limits of Green street on the West, Larkin on the North, Vallejo on the South and Hyde on the East. Passed.

REPORTED MURDER OF FOUR MEN.—The Indians in this vicinity report that four white men were killed at or near the upper crossing of Mad River, on the trail from Bucksport to Weaverville, and that their cattle (eight head) are running loose in that vicinity. Several squaws, of different tribes, tell the same story, and a partial credence is given to it from the fact that Mr. Hull and three other men, with that number of cattle, left Eureka some four weeks ago, and have not since been heard from.—Humboldt Times.
